1. FOIA

Town Administrator: Council, according to your agenda, you have a few items to be voted on tonight.

We have representatives from Central Pines Regional Council, Alana Keegan, Lee Worsley, and Wilma Lanley here this evening.

- Regional Council of Governments for Moore County, job is to be an extension of the staff. There would be a seat for Taylortown on the board; focuses on aging, housing, economic development, transportation, etc.
 - Planning Assistance, added benefit of grant writing, providing planning staff, conversations about water and sewer

Central Pines:

MCEDP

I seek a motion to adopt resolution ADM 2-2025.

Cotton: I move that we adopt resolution ADM 2- 2025, a resolution to grant an appropriation to Moore County Economic Development Partnership for Fiscal Year 2026 in the amount of \$500.

Historic Preservation Commission – MAYOR PRO TEM MOODY

Our town council would like to appoint a volunteer Taylortown Historic Preservation Commission to work with the Taylortown History Museum to preserve our town's history and advise our Planning Commission and staff on establishing one or more historic districts in Taylortown as part of our town's comprehensive plan.

These commissioners will serve staggered terms of 3 years and 2 years.

The 3-year appointments will be Wendy Martin, Yvette McCormick, and Reverend Rose Sharpe. The 2-year appointments will be Lawerence Morrison and Felton McRae.

Public Works and Utilities:

Recap on BUMP training.

Brandon Livengood: Meters were read on April 1st. This month, we have been able to identify higher water usage and alert customers via door-hanger that their water usage

is higher than normal. We give customers notice and offer them a chance to discuss potential issues with us as an extension of our customer service.

Planning Department:

Review of Public Input Sessions.

We had public input sessions where everyone was invited out to speak on what they wanted to see in the new comprehensive plan for the town. Public input sessions were held on March 25th at 6:30 pm, April 2nd at 10:00 am, and April 5th at 10:00 am.

Public Input Sessions were noticed in council meetings, online on the website as well as via facebook, and via flyer as councilwoman cotton went door to door with them, handing out about 150 flyers and messaging people directly.

Collective attendance of the Public Input Sessions were:

- 14 people were present at the first public input session, including all councilmembers and four out of five members of the Planning Commission.
- 17 people were present at the second public input session.
- 22 people were present at the third public input session.
- Total of 3 input sessions with a total of 53 people in attendance.

Overall, we had three productive meetings, and we were happy to see this level of community engagement.

Around 600 people attending virtually, we want to thank Mayor Pro Tem Moody for providing refreshments.
